General Information

HELMETS: Helmets must be worn at all times while riding!

REGISTRATION: Located in the Royal Street Room. Registration will be open Friday 8/9 from 1:00 p.m. to 12 midnight

ID BADGES: Your badges are needed for meals and Rally identification.

White badge: On site Eden Resort registration
Blue badge: Off site registration

BICYCLE STORAGE: Bicycles will be allowed in the rooms.

PROBLEMS ON THE ROAD: Be prepared to handle problems on the road. Carry identification and change for phone calls. Our SAG wagons use cellular phones which are monitored during the rides. Please give your name, name of the ride, your location and phone number you are calling from. Wait where you are for assistance. **PLEASE NOTE:** Fatigue is not considered an emergency. Choose your rides carefully. Lancaster county roads are classed as gentle rolling hills but some hills may be difficult for teams not used to the terrain. The E.T.R. staff will be glad to discuss any ride with you. Drink plenty of fluids, eat, and take breaks while on the road. A water bottle on your tandem is a must.

Tandem teams should be equipped with tools and skills to take care of minor repairs on the road, such as repairing flat tires. You should have tire levers, patch kit, spare inner tube, and a working bicycle pump. The TREK WRENCH FORCE will be able to help with service problems during the rally. They will be present at the Eden Resort and Saturday lunch stop.

Places of Interest

Landis Valley Farm Museum: This state run museum has a superb collection of early American rural life artifacts.

Pennsylvania Railroad Museum: This state run museum displays restored trains dating from the earliest days of railroad history.

Ephrata Cloisters: An early American religious community restored to the appearance of colonial times

Clock & Watch Museum: Displays a fine collection chronicling the history of keeping time.

Rockford: The restored home of Revolutionary War General, Edward Hand

Wheatland: Home of Pennsylvania's only president.

Harley Davidson factory: Mecca for the Harley Davidson motorcycle fan. (Factory Tour)

Cornwall Furnace: Early American Iron Foundry that cast Cannon barrels for George Washington's Army

Strasburg Railroad: Live steam railroad. Oldest short line railroad in continuous operation

Gast Classic Car Museum: Modern day automobile classics presented for your enjoyment of the cars or years past

Rides Descriptions

Friday Afternoon: Teams arriving early can explore the surrounding country roads on their own or take a pleasant ride to Lititz.

PRETZELS & CHOCOLATE: A 21 mile ride to the historic town of Lititz was founded in 1756. The brothers house in church square served as a hospital during the revolutionary war. The cemetery behind the church is the burial place of John Augustus Sutter on whose land gold was discovered in California. Visit the Sturgis pretzel bakery and Wilbur chocolate factory. Take your panniers and bring back pretzels and Wilbur buds. (Rolling hills, Borough streets, country roads)

Saturday Morning: All rides leave from south east parking lot. (Rear of Eden)

EARLY BIRD: A 9.9 mile warm up ride before breakfast. Ride through tree lined residential estates. (Flat, Residential & rural)

MANHEIM SHORT RIDE: 17.8 mile of rolling farmlands on rural roads and residential developments. (9:15-9:30am)

MASTERSONVILLE RIDE: 22.9 mile to the crossroads town of Mastersonville. Visit a small town country store and head back to Manheim for lunch. Rolling hills on rural roads and residential developments. (9:00-9:15am)

Rides Descriptions Continued

TANDEMS FOR LUNCH: 33.8 mile winding tour of typical Lancaster county roads. Cross 2 covered bridges as you go through Brownstown bypassing Lititz on your ride to the lunch stop in Manheim. (8:45-9:00am)

CORNWALL FURNACE RIDE: A challenging 45.2 mile ride to the Revolutionary Cornwall Furnace in hills of southern Lebanon county. A 3 mile downhill at the 33 mile point makes the ride worth the effort. Beautiful scenery, Rural roads, and residential developments (hills are manageable in the middle chain ring for stronger riders) (8:30-8:45am)

Saturday Afternoon

SHORT RIDE HOME: The most direct route to the Eden Resort Inn. 14.8 miles of rolling farmlands on rural roads and residential developments.

RETURN TO EDEN: 25.5 miles for the team that wants more of the Lancaster county country side. Rolling hills and residential developments.

Sunday Morning All rides leave from south east rear parking lot. (Rear of Eden)

EARLY BIRD: A 9.9 mile warm up ride before breakfast. Ride through tree lined residential estates. (Flat, Residential & rural)

Rides Descriptions Continued

KODAK MOMENTS 1: 20.3 miles of Lancaster County's best tandem riding. Covered bridges, buggies, beautiful farms and quiet country roads. (Bring your camera and take home some memories)

KODAK MOMENTS 2: 31.0 miles with more of Lancaster County's best tandem riding. Covered bridges, buggies, beautiful farms and quiet country roads.

KODAK MOMENTS 3: 40.3 miles with more of Lancaster County's best tandem riding. Covered bridges, buggies, beautiful farms and quiet country roads.

KODAK MOMENTS 4: 51.0 miles for the team working up an appetite for the lunch back at the Eden. More of Lancaster County's best tandem riding. Covered bridges, buggies, beautiful farms and quiet country roads.

NEW HOLLAND REMOTE: A short 10.9 mile drive with your tandem to New Holland and you can enjoy a flat 22.9 mile ride through the beautiful farm lands that are the pride of Lancaster county.

Child Care

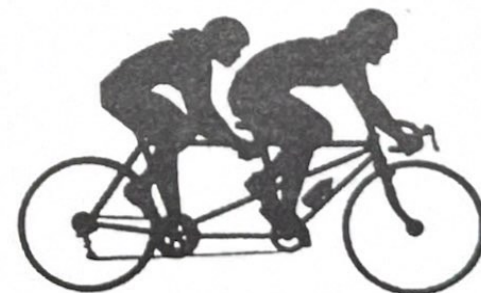

NOTES, REVISIONS & UPDATES

PROGRAM CHANGES:

Page 2: Badge colors, (Orange-E.T.R. Staff), (Yellow-on site teams), (Violet-off site team).

Page 5: Breakfast (on site registrants) will be in the Grande & Regency rooms

Flea market will be held in the State Room in the event of rain.

There will be a 30 minute intermission after the juggling act to allow clearing of tables. The Moonlighters will follow the intermission in the banquet room. Persons registered as off site participants are welcome to return to hear the Moonlighters music.

Large print programs are available for visually impaired stokers

RIDES & CUE SHEETS:

The rides will not be marked with arrows

The Friday (Pretzels & Chocolate ride) is a 21.1 mile ride not a 17.8 mile ride as titled on the cue sheet.

Sunday ride start times are at your discretion. Plan your ride to allow time to return to the EDEN in time for lunch and the 1:00 PM check out time.

The ride (Distance 40.3 miles) ride is a Sunday ride. Title should read (KODAK MOMENTS Distance 40.3miles).

Ride cautions: Use caution on the covered bridges. They are narrow and some bridges may have wide cracks between the floor boards that can allow narrower 700c tires to drop through. High corn can make it difficult to see clearly in some areas.

The **Emergency Phone Number (354-4374)** on your name tag is for a telephone answering service that will relay your message to the E.T.R. staff. Please identify your ride, last cue and phone number you are calling from. Stay where you are until help arrives. **The Eden Resort Inn is not equipped to handle the E.T.R. emergency phone calls.**

SATURDAY LUNCH STOP:

The picnic area is the large pavilion located behind the community swimming pool. We have access to the rest rooms at the entrance to the pool. **POTTY PARITY:** Women will be able to use the additional rest rooms in the shower/changing room

Rain plans for the Saturday lunch stop will be announced at breakfast on Saturday morning.
